## DEAR FRIEND OF THE 916 EDUCATION FOUNDATION...

The Foundation kicked off the 2011-2012 school year with a successful membership drive that raised nearly \$48,000 in contributions. We are especially grateful for the support and participation of Northeast Metro 916 staff, whose memberships are a valuable source of support. During the membership drive the Foundation hosted the 916 Retiree Breakfast with the purpose of celebrating the talented former district employees who made such an important impact in the educational experiences of students served by Northeast Metro 916. We also proudly recognized Gallagher & Associates, Inc. and HealthPartners for their participation in our new Business Partners Program.

In October we hosted our first Spooky Family 5K Fun Run/Walk and Costume Parade in Lakewood Hills Park. We had a great turnout in our first year, with 82 participants and more than 50 businesses and organizations sponsoring and donating prizes. The Taste of Northeast Metro 916 Gala was one of the most successful galas in the history of the foundation, raising more than \$23,000. In February we hosted our second Antiques and Arts Fair, partnering with Northeast Metro 916 staff and local businesses to offer a fun-filled day of antique appraisals, guest speakers, student art, kids crafts and a craft boutique. We ended the year with the 25th Annual Golf Tournament, with golfers and supporters joining us at Indian Hills Golf Club to raise more than \$18,000.

Thanks to funds raised from our activities, as well as contributions from many businesses, service organizations and individuals, we were able to provide financial support to the students, staff and programs of Northeast Metro 916. Last fall, the foundation board awarded 60 grants totaling more than \$37,000. These grants funded much-needed programs, supplies and equipment throughout the district. This spring the board awarded \$12,500 in scholarships to 23 outstanding Northeast Metro 916 students. And each month during the 2011-2012 school year, a Student of the Month was recognized at 15 sites for achieving personal goals, showing remarkable improvement and striving to reach potential.

We want to thank those of you who have made our efforts possible. It is through your generous contributions of time, talent and financial giving that we have been able to provide economic support to Northeast Metro 916's partnerships in special education, career and technical education, and a broad range of other educational services.
