


916 Education Foundation Gives Back to Students and Staff

B/VI Team Awarded Grant for Low-Vision Devices

Joni Purrington from the 916 Education Foundation awarded the 916 Blind/Visually Impaired (B/VI) team with a grant to support the expansion of the low-vision assessment kit to include more low-vision devices. Low-vision devices are necessary for students who struggle with distance vision to gain access to the classroom, as well as the community. These devices are benefiting the seven teachers who are serving 70 students with low vision.
