

As we continue to see the effect the pandemic has on our schools, now more than ever the 916 Education Foundation feels the need to meet our mission of supporting our students and staff with student scholarships, program learning grants, and student and staff recognition.

We are able to meet our Foundation's mission each year through the generous support we receive from our membership, business associates, friends, and Northeast Metro 916 district staff, and their participation in our annual fundraising efforts. Even though the pandemic of recent months forced the cancellation of our Annual Golf Tournament this past June (after 32 straight years of success!), our Foundation still saw a record fall Membership Drive last September, followed by the success of our Annual Gala in February.

Looking back on the year, we were able to award funds of over \$50,000 in grants to enhance learning programs and another \$33,800 in student scholarships to qualifying seniors. In addition, the Gala "Fund-a-Need" provided over \$11,000 that went towards funding music program needs in the classrooms at our new high school — Quora, located in Little Canada.

Each year we see the stories of our students succeeding in their educational programs and life skills pursuits, and the 916 Education Foundation is proud to be a part of supporting these students. In addition, we continue to acknowledge the exceptional work of our staff and recognize their dedicated service to the success of our District's specialized learning programs.

It is a pleasure for us to share the information in the Annual Report. Looking ahead to the 2020-21 school year, we know that meeting our funding goals will be more critical than ever, and we hope you will continue to support our 916 Education Foundation and its mission. 



The music class is an opportunity for our scholars to explore their musical talents by learning to play an instrument, recording songs and recording their own music. The ultimate goal is to do formal recording with the equipment in a sound booth to elevate production of musical abilities to their fullest.

We will be ordering more electronic equipment such as music recording apps, mixing boards, Avid Surface and Apple ipads with garage band.
